FEB 12TH RECAP



Both Florida State and Maryland got off to undefeated starts last month, but after Super Bowl Sunday, only one could remain perfect on the year. Fortunately for the Seminoles, a stellar second half led to a 2-0 record as Florida State downed Maryland 28-19. FSU led by three points at halftime before blowing the game open in the second half. Aaron Mueller, Ryan Henschel and Zachary Kim each scored six points for the victors. Dylan Fern powered the Maryland offense with eight points.

After suffering an opening week loss to Florida State in which Wake Forest was doubled up in points, the Demon Deacons had to come out and respond last Sunday. Sure enough, the team dug deep and put together an incredible effort that beat Virginia 27-25. Brandon Ballarini finished with a game high 15 points in the victory while Eli Carl and Preston Pippen each added four. Aiden Maher and Jake Wolf led Virginia with seven points apiece; Daniel Wolf added five of his own.



North Carolina was looking as if it was in midseason form last Sunday as the Tar Heels battled the Golden Eagles of Boston College. Wasting no time, the Heels ran out to a 10-2 first quarter lead but the play of Jalen Axibal pushed the Eagles back within two points at the break. In the second half, however, UNC pulled away and claimed a 31-26 win at the Basketball Warehouse. Zach Goldstein led UNC with 16 points while Nicholas Martinelli added six; Axibal led all scorers with 19.

Virginia Tech went out last Sunday and picked up a much needed win over an NC State team that was facing the same situation: win and even your record or lose and fall to 0-2. VaTech's defense held NC State scoreless in the second quarter which was just enough to keep a steady margin throughout the contest. The Hokies went on to win 15-12 as Luke Woodson scored a game high eight points for the victors; Brady Anders added three. Daniel Wilcox paced NC State with six.



Well it was sure looking like THE LEAGUE's Miami Hurricanes were about to do the same thing the real Canes did to Duke earlier this season, but the mini Blue Devils held on just long enough to defeat Miami 34-32, staying perfect on the year with a 2-0 record. The power combo of Dylan Mankoff and Blake Lidskin were at it again, scoring 14 and 10 points respectively to lead the Blue Devils. Andy Pekar did all he could to try and push Miami over the top; he finished with 15 points.

After being added to THE LEAGUE this winter, the Clemson Tigers have made quite an impression! The onslaught of orange brought even more offense to the table last Saturday as the Tigers stung the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets with a 32-21 loss at the Christian Heritage Academy in Northfield. The Tigers led by six at halftime and cruised over the final two quarters as Jake Haley scored a team high 12 points in the win. GT's Jalyn Gibson finished as the game's high scorer with 16.
